FALL OF JUNIOR YEAR

- Begin to think seriously about what you
 want in a college: big or small campus,
 urban or rural setting, highly competitive or
 less so. Exam your long term goals.
- Begin to research colleges: start with Xello.
 Develop a list of colleges that appear to meet your needs and make a comparison list.
- Meet with college admission representatives either in person or virtually
- Evaluate the classes you want to take for Senior year and make sure they are in line with admission standards.
- Attend college fairs search <u>www.wefs.org</u>. There is a Wisconsin Education Fair hosted locally every fall.
- Attend a College Goal session www.collegegoalwi.org.

WINTER OF JUNIOR YEAR

- Continue to think about what colleges you might be interested in attending
- Continue to challenge yourself academically.
- Prep for the ACT that will be happening in spring.
- Continue participating in college visits

SPRING OF JUNIOR YEAR

- Take the ACT in March
- Maintain your grades and continue to challenge yourself academically
- Being visiting colleges you are interested in and attend open houses

SUMMER OF JUNIOR YEAR

- Narrow down the list of colleges you are interested in attending. If you can, visit school that interest you.
- Decide whether you are going to apply under a college's early decision or early action program. Be sure to learn about the program deadlines and requirements.
- Begin preparing for the application process: draft application essays; put together your portfolio or resume.
 Determine whom you will use as references.
