# I. Welcome!

Welcome to the 2019 School District of Milton Summer School Program! A wide variety of courses and activities are being planned for the upcoming summer session in an effort to meet the needs and interests of students in pre-kindergarten through grade 12. Summer school provides students, as well as staff, a wonderful opportunity to explore alternative interests, challenge one's abilities, and gain additional academic experiences in less than traditional settings.

We invite you to read about the various programs and classes that we will be offering this summer in the Course Information section of this handbook, along with the other important pieces of information contained in the following General Information section. We provide this handbook to the youngest in each family. In addition, registration information is available on the School District of Milton's Summer School web page.

## III. General Information

**A. Registration** - Students currently attending Milton Schools: Families are encouraged to register for enrichment and remedial classes using Skyward Family Access. Summer school scheduling is available through Skyward between March 1, 6:00 a.m. through March 15, 12:00 a.m. (midnight). Students with a teacher recommendation for academic make-up need to register using a paper registration form. Students who do not currently attend Milton Schools: Families must register for enrichment classes using the registration form. All registrations will be processed on a first come, first served basis.

Registration forms can be mailed in or dropped off at the Summer School Office. The mailing address for the Milton Summer School Program is PO Box 476, Milton, WI 53563. Registration forms that are mailed in need to be postmarked by March 15. The Summer School Office is located at the high school. In order to process a registration, the registration form must be filled out completely (one form per student) and any applicable fees paid.

If a course/session is cancelled due to insufficient enrollment or other reasons, parents will be notified and offered alternative courses for their student. Students should register for courses with regards to the grade level they will enter in the fall.

There will be no late registration available with the exception of academic make-up.

**B. Fees** - Material and non-resident fees are due at the time of registration. Some enrichment courses require a specified nonrefundable material fee to offset the cost of supplies. Material Fees are indicated with course descriptions.

Students who are not residents of the School District of Milton are welcome to enroll in summer school. Non-residents should note that a tuition fee of \$20.00 for each class (enrichment, remedial, academic make-up), along with any applicable material fees, will be charged. High school classes taken for credit will cost \$100.00 per class for non-residents. The non-resident tuition fee *does not* apply to students who currently attend Milton schools. The non-resident tuition fee *does* apply to students who have enrolled in Milton schools and plan to attend in the fall.

Fees can be paid online during registration or mailed to Milton Summer School, PO Box 476, Milton, WI 53563. All fees can be included on one check payable to "School District of Milton." Please indicate the student's name(s) with your payment. For those families who may need financial assistance with the fees, please see the fee waiver form on our website at <https://www.milton.k12.wi.us/> and/or contact Summer School Administrator Sarah Stuckey at 868-9360.

**C. Locations** - Summer school will be located at Milton West Elementary, Northside Intermediate School, Milton Middle School, and Milton High School. There will be a shuttle bus available to transport students who must change schools between sessions. Tentative class locations are indicated next to the course listings as well as on the last page of this handbook.

**D. Dates and Times** - Four Week Classes will begin on Monday, June 10, and conclude Friday, July 3. Six Week High School Courses for Credit will begin on Monday, June 10 and conclude Friday, July 19. There will be no classes on July 4 or July 5. Session 1 classes run from 8:15 a.m. - 9:45 a.m. Session 2 classes run from 10:00 a.m. - 11:30 a.m. The dates for summer school are subject to change in the event the School District of Milton has to make up additional days due to inclement weather.

#### **E. Regulations**

**Attendance:** attendance needs to be regular. Family trips planned during Summer School place your child and perhaps other classmates and the teacher at a disadvantage. If, however, you anticipate an absence, please contact your child's summer school building office(s) with that information.

**Dress:** students may dress casually but should always dress appropriately

**Conduct:** regular school-year conduct rules will be followed

**Behavior:** significant misbehavior may result in removal from summer school

**F. Visitors** - Allowing friends and visiting relatives to accompany students to summer school classes has posed a variety of difficult situations. We cannot ensure a safe environment when we lack adequate emergency information on guests, nor can we provide appropriate supervision for the extra students. We request that students not bring visitors to summer school.

**G. Information and Assistance** - If you have any questions about summer school courses and/or registration, please contact us by leaving a message, along with daytime and evening phone numbers, on our voicemail (868-9575). We will return your call as soon as possible.

## **IV. Four Types of Courses**

**A. Academic Make-Up Courses** - Academic make-up classes for grades 4-8 are held during the four week session. These classes are listed by school and are indicated as academic make-up. There are no fees for academic make-up courses unless your child is a non-resident. Students recommended or required to take academic make-up courses will be notified in late May/early June by the student's school office or by the student's school counselor.

**Grades 4-6:** Academic make-up courses for grades 4-6 are located at Northside Intermediate School.

**Grades 7-8:** Academic make-up courses for grades 7-8 are located at Milton Middle School.

**B. High School Courses for Credit** - High School courses for credit are held during the **six week session**.

**Grades 9-12:** Academic make-up courses for grades 9-12 are located at Milton High School. These classes are worth one-half credit for successful completion. There are no fees for academic make-up courses unless your child is a non-resident. Students recommended or required to take academic make-up courses will be notified in late May/early June by the student's school office or by the student's school counselor.

**C. Remedial Courses** - Remedial courses are held during the four week summer school session. These classes are listed by school and indicated as remedial. A variety of remedial courses are offered to students going into grades 1-8. Remedial courses are designed to help prepare the student for the grade level he/she will be entering in the fall. Enrollment in a remedial course is based upon teacher recommendation. Parents should receive this recommendation prior to receiving this handbook.

If you feel your child is in need of remedial course instruction this summer but have not received a letter stating so, please contact your child's teacher. It is equally important to note that if you have received a letter of recommendation, it is still your responsibility to register your child. The letter of recommendation does not register your child for you.

**D. Enrichment Courses** - A variety of enrichment courses are offered to students during the four week summer school session. Courses are available for students in Pre-K - grade 12. The curriculum is designed to provide expanded learning opportunities and experiences for students. These courses have been designed to meet a wide range of interests and needs.

## V. Courses Listed By School

#### B. ENRICHMENT CLASSES:

**Alphabet Antics (Grades K-1)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

Alphabet Antics is a course designed to explore the sights and sounds of the alphabet through stories, songs, games, drawing, and various arts and crafts projects. The letters and their sounds are reinforced in a relaxed, motivational setting, where every child is successful. (no material fee)

**Art, Building and Coding ... Oh My! (Grades 1-3)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

Students will explore hands-on activities that incorporate science, technology, engineering, art, and math! This class is designed for younger students to introduce and explore the different aspects of STEAM. Students will code, create, design, and have fun! Students will work together to innovate and problem solve. Join us this summer to get your creativity flowing! (no material fee)

**Arts & Crafts I (Grades K-2)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

Students will enjoy learning about artists and making lots of fun, useful projects using their techniques! We'll even have a gallery to show off our projects! (\$5.00 material fee)

### **Dinosaurs (Grades K-2)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

We will be studying dinosaurs through fun and exciting stories, art projects, drawing and coloring, and other great activities! (\$5.00 material fee)

### **Fun in the Sun (Grades K-2)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

Come play! Join in outdoor and indoor activities and projects for summer fun. We will have a blast with bubbles, games, water and plenty of hands-on learning experiences. (no material fee)

### **Fun with Books (Grades K-1)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

Students will listen to a variety of books and participate in activities centered around those books. Children will make their own books, make art and craft projects, taste-test food, conduct science experiments, and play math games. (no material fee)

### **Jump Start to 4K (Grade 4K)**

*Four Sessions:*

**1A** June 10 - June 21 at 8:15-9:45, **1B** June 24 - July 3 at 8:15-9:45

**2A** June 10 - June 21 at 10:00-11:30, **2B** June 24 - July 3 at 10:00-11:30

This two-week class is offered to help children entering 4K get a jump start to next year by offering a glimpse of the world of Pre-Kindergarten! Circle time, read alouds, songs, dancing, projects, and centers are just some activities your child will do during summer school. Children will also be practicing social skills, problem solving skills, begin to follow simple classroom directions, and explore the learning environment. (no material fee)

### **Kindergarten Enrichment (Grade K)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

Welcome to Kindergarten! Kindergarten Enrichment is designed to prepare your child for their first year of school. Throughout the summer we will be working on social skills, fine motor skills, a calendar routine, and being introduced to numbers, shapes, colors, and name writing. Our day is full of fun and exciting activities that focus around a theme. (no material fee)

### **Let's Make Music & Art! (Grades K-3)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

Music and MORE comes to life in this exciting class! We will explore music through singing, dancing, movement, props, books, rhythm instruments, and daily projects. Get ready to make music and more this summer! (\$5.00 material fee)

### **Old MacDonald Had Some Vowels (Grades 1-2)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

Get ready to sing, dance and have fun with Old MacDonald and his friends this summer. This is an active class that will help build confidence in both reading and writing. We will build puzzles, create books, and play games. This is a great way to reinforce the importance of how much fun reading and writing can be! (no material fee)

### **Organized Games & Sports (Grades 1-4)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

FUN is required! Enjoy the outdoors while learning the fundamentals that lead to team sports. This course includes creative variations of some old favorites such as dodgeball, kickball, soccer, and Capture-The-Flag as well as some wacky, nontraditional tagging games. Cooperative play and sportsmanship are emphasized. Don't "dodge" the opportunity to "capture" some fun in the sun this summer! (no material fee)

### **Reading Booster Club (Grades 2-4)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

Want to have fun learning to be a better reader? The students in this course will have fun doing hands on activities, using their imaginations, and even creating their own books on iPads. The focus of this class will be reading and learning about different authors both in the classroom, outside, and through technology. We will spend a lot of time "boosting" our reading with some terrific books! (no material fee)

### **Sensational Summer Science (Grades 1-2)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

What is "science"? We will answer this question by examining plants, creepy-crawlies, doing chemistry with Kool-Aid, taking nature-walks around the school and much more. Many of our experiments will be done outside so that we can enjoy the sunshine and get messy! Science can be many things and this summer, it will be fun! (\$5.00 material fee)

### **Under the Deep Blue Sea (Grades K-3)**

*Session 1 Grades K-1, Session 2 Grades 2-3*

Take the plunge this summer! Students enrolled in this course will "dive" into the ocean and explore the world below. Join us as we experience the deep blue sea through books, artistry, and a growing knowledge of ocean life. This is your chance to get your feet wet! (\$5.00 material fee)

### **Yoga, Mindfulness and Play in Early Childhood (Grade 4K)**

*Four Sessions:*

**1A** June 10 - June 21 at 8:15-9:45, **1B** June 24 - July 3 at 8:15-9:45

**2A** June 10 - June 21 at 10:00-11:30, **2B** June 24 - July 3 at 10:00-11:30

This is a 2 week course that will get your child moving mindfully while learning the rules and routines of the 4K Classroom. We will explore yoga through literacy and focus on social & emotional development. Your child will participate in circle time, music & movement, facilitated play, and snack time~ all while fostering independence, promoting self-regulation, and self-awareness. Children will build community, meet new friends and learn through play! (no material fee)

### **C. ENRICHMENT CLASSES:**

#### **American Girls (Grades 3-5)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

Students will learn about American History and today's world through the American Girl Dolls! We will make crafts for our dolls, play games, make snacks, read books, and watch videos. Come explore the world with American Girl. (\$5.00 material fee)

### **Art From Around the World (Grades 2-3)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

Let's learn about art from different cultures of people from around the world! We'll visit the China, Africa, Mexico, Norway, and Japan. We will use a variety of 2D and 3D art materials. This course will be fun and diverse for learners! (\$5.00 material fee)

### **Arts & Crafts II (Grades 3-4)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

Use your creative talents to help design new crafts. Depending on the child's grade level, this course will expose students to the art of making collages, papier-mache, stenciling, stamping, painting, drawing, and ceramics. Explore the world of art and let your imagination work for you. (\$8.00 material fee)

### **Baseball (Grades 4-8)**

*Sessions 1 & 2 (students can enroll in both sessions)*

Students will learn and practice fundamental skills of baseball through drills and games. Skills taught will be: throwing, catching, hitting, bunting, pitching, and base running. The class will participate in actual games arranged by the instructor. (\$5.00 material fee)

### **Basketball (Grades 3-6)**

*Session 1 Grades 5-6, Session 2 Grades 3-4*

This basketball course will help you become a better basketball player by focusing on drills, games, and other activities designed to improve your shooting, ball-handling, passing, and other skills. (no material fee)

### **Beginning Piano (Grades 2-3)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

Students will learn basic piano skills, music notes, and other basic music skills. By the end of the course, students will be able to play simple tunes. Musical games and crafts will also be included with this course. (no material fee)

### **The Chocolate Factory (Grades 3-6)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

This course is open to all young, aspiring Willie Wonkas! Yummy chocolate reading and writing activities, scrumptious math lessons, delicious chocolate making and tasting opportunities will capture your interest and satisfy your urges for a summer dripping with fun. Other chocolate adventures will include Internet activities, collecting chocolate recipes to create a recipe booklet, and enjoying in the construction of a chocolate town. (\$8.00 material fee)

### **Club Fit (Grades K-4)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

Come have fun staying fit! Join us for stretches, warm-up walking, and circuit training. We'll have fun playing games like *SPUD* and *What Time is Dinner, Mr. Fox*, along with water activities on hot days. We'll also learn about nutrition and enjoy some tasty snacks. Be part of the club - join Club Fit! (\$8.00 material fee)

### **Fitness Fun (Grades 4-7)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

If you want to stay in shape and learn about fitness and healthy eating then this is the class for you! Whether you are an athlete who wants to stay in shape for your sport or someone who just wants to be more active, this class is designed to show you how to be fit in a fun way! Each day we will do different activities and games that build your endurance and strengthen your body. We will do yoga, pilates, step-aerobics, jump-roping, etc. Twice a week we will enjoy a healthy snack to promote healthy eating as part of a healthy lifestyle. (\$8.00 material fee)

### **Flag Football (Grades 3-6)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

Fundamentals and techniques of flag football will be taught, along with game activities. Running drills and a variety of other games will be offered as well. (no material fee)

### **French (Grades K-6)**

*Session 2*

Do you like to sing and play games? If so, come learn French! We will learn basic French while having fun, including going on an imaginary trip to France. (\$5.00 material fee)

### **Jewelry Making (Grades 3-6)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

Join us for Jewelry Making! Students will create jewelry (and a few other accessories) using a variety of materials. We will use wire, stretch magic, hemp, and memory wire to make items such as friendship bracelets, rings, necklaces, polymer beads, and flip-flops. (\$10.00 material fee)

### **Lego Robotics (Grades 5-6)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

In this course students will work in the world of coding. Online coding games will be played as students begin to understand how coding can be used to operate robots. Students will also be constructing and programming LEGO Mindstorm robots. (no material fee)

### **Minecraft EDU (Grades 3-6)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

Think Minecraft is just a video game? Thank again! Create, explore, and put your problem-solving skills to the test with storyboarding and level design, while learning to build and customize amazing worlds. (no material fee)

### **World Explorers (Grades 2-6)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

Students will explore the cultures, traditions, sites and foods of different cities, states and countries via different media sources (online research and books). Students will research the destinations using books and websites. Students will develop empathy for other ways of life and a sense of wonder about the beauty and variety of cultures around the world.

### **World Languages (Grades 3-6)**

*Session 1*

Are you interested in languages and culture? If so, this is the class for you? We will learn the basics of Japanese, German, Arabic, and American Sign Language. Basic topics include: alphabet, colors, numbers, speaking, and culture. Class activities will be supported with videos, books, music, games, and food tasting. (\$5.00 material fee)

### **C. ENRICHMENT CLASSES:**

#### **Babysitting Skills (Grades 6-12)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

Interested in babysitting? The Babysitting Skills course will help you develop the knowledge and skills necessary to be a confident and successful babysitter! You will learn what the job of babysitting involves, the developmental stages of infants and young children, and how to properly care for all their needs. First Aid and CPR, along with handling emergency situations, will be addressed and practiced. The class will take a field trip to a local child care center and interact with children of various ages. By the end of the course, you will have materials to help you be the best babysitter you can be,

including the babysitting kit you create. On the last day, you will have the opportunity to babysit for young children (in the classroom setting) as the class will host a "Play Day" for some community families. *Due to the extensive material, attendance is imperative for this course.* (\$15.00 material fee)

### **Creative Dramatics (Grades 4-8)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

Do you like to act? Are you comfortable in front of large groups of people? Do you enjoy a fast paced production with little to no time to spare? Then Creative Dramatics is for you! Actors and actresses will perform one, and only one, approximately 50 minute play on July 3, 2019 so please make certain you will be in summer school on July 3, 2019. (\$5.00 material fee)

### **Fishing (Grades 3-8)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

This class spotlights the excitement and enjoyment of fishing. Students will learn many facts about how to identify fish, rig tackle, and catch more fish. A hands-on emphasis will let students practice casting techniques, knot tying, and jig and lure making. A fishing trip to a local pond along with an expert speaker is also planned. (\$5.00 material fee)

### **Future Engineering Design Challenge (Grades 6-8)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

Future City starts with a question—how can we make the world a better place? To answer it, 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students imagine, research, design, and build cities of the future that showcase their solution to a citywide sustainability issue. Past topics include resilient cities, stormwater management, urban agriculture, public spaces, and green energy. Participants work in teams to complete a virtual city design (using SimCity); a 1,500-word city essay; a scale model built from recycled materials; a project plan, and a presentation. (\$5.00 material fee)

### **Girls Weightlifting (Grades 8-12) | June 10-July 25, Mondays-Thursdays (No class July 4)**

*Four Sessions:*

**Session 5A** 6:30-7:15 a.m., **Session 5B** 7:15-8:00 a.m.

**Session 1C** 8:15-9:00 a.m., **Session 1D** 9:00-9:45 a.m.

This program will teach girls how to use a variety of weight lifts and activities, while instructing students on proper techniques and developing muscle strength and physical fitness. This class is monitored and individualized. *Please note the different dates and days.* (no material fee)

### **It's Snack Time (Grades 1-3)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

It's Snack Time is a hands-on class designed to teach children how to prepare healthy after school snacks the entire family can enjoy without using an oven. Examples include Party Sandwiches, Honey Bees, Nibbling Fish and nutritious drinks such as Orange Smoothies, Rainbow Coolers, and Strawberries Through a Straw. Recipe booklets will be given out to each child at our culminating tasting party. (\$5.00 material fee)

### **Technology Leaders in Training (Grades 7-9)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

Are you a LEADER who is good with technology? Do you enjoy playing with technology and teaching others to use it? Join this team and learn to be a leader of technology in the classroom and in your community! Students who join this class MUST be comfortable or willing to be a leader in front of other students or adults. We will experience new and exciting technologies. We will end our course by hosting a Technology Fair for all summer school staff and students. (no material fee)

## **Milton High School**

### **A. ACADEMIC CLASSES FOR CREDIT:**

#### **Academic Make-Up (Grades 9-12)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

*0.5 Credit Course - Six Week Session*

High school courses for credit may only be taken by students in need of academic make-up credit to stay on track for graduation. A counselor recommendation is needed to register. Students have up to six weeks to complete the course. Most classes are in a supported online forum.

### **Physical Education (Grades 9-12)**

*Session 1*

*0.5 Credit Course - Six Week Session*

Students will master skills and movement patterns and apply learned skills to specific team sports. Activities to include, but not limited to: tennis, soccer, softball, floor hockey, basketball, volleyball, fitness and weight training, and swimming, with an emphasis in fitness.

## **B. ENRICHMENT CLASSES:**

### **Baking, Cooking & the Community (Grades 4-8)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

Your favorite recipes from Cookies! Cookies! Cookies! and Magic Chefs will be combined for this new class. Young chefs will practice essential kitchen skills needed for baking and cooking. We'll get hands-on and introduce kids to the fundamentals - from reading and following recipes to the importance of kitchen safety. Young chefs will enjoy working alongside classmates to create foods to sample, take home, and to sell for community charity. This class will boost your child's confidence in the kitchen and help them create a culinary community connection. (\$15.00 material fee)

### **Field Biology (Grades 5-6)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

Field Biology is a class for students who love to explore the outdoors! In classroom sessions (1-2 days/week), students learn adaptations and identification of animals and plants, including poisonous plants of our area, and the basics of aquarium and terrarium setup and maintenance. Field days (3-4 days/week) allow students to observe, capture and identify different animals and plants. Depending on which session, students must arrive early or stay late on field days to allow for travel time. (no material fee)

### **Gymnastics (Grades K-3)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

This course is designed to promote body awareness, balance, coordination and beginning gymnastics skills. Students will be challenged to strengthen their abilities on the floor exercise, uneven bars, balance beam and springboards. (no material fee)

### **Hawks' Nest Junior (Grades 6-8)**

*Sessions 1 & 2*

What would you like to see sold in the Hawks' Nest school store? Now is your chance to make it happen! In this course students have the opportunity to design new products for The Hawks' Nest. Students will handle the process of researching, creating, and promoting the new items culminating in the products being introduced and sold in the store! Help your friends and family show their Milton spirit by designing the clothes they wear! (\$5.00 material fee)

### **High School 101 (Grade 9)**

*Four Sessions:*
