Allen Foundation College Scholarship

The Allen Foundation Scholarship is the longest running, continuous scholarship at Milton High School, dating back to 1975. Marion and Harris Allen were longtime residents of Milton who worked hard and lived a mission to develop a sense of community and good will within all its residents. Moving to Milton in 1953, Harris established the first telephone company in Southern Wisconsin. Marion dedicated her life to philanthropic causes. Having started at the age of 10, in 1918, rolling bandages for World War One, she would lead or contribute to dozens of community organizations in Milton and all of Rock Country until her death at the age of 98 in 2007. One of her most visible contributions was the donation of the Gathering Place as a place for our areas Senior Citizens. Both Marian and Harris placed a high value on education, having both graduated from the University of Madison and wanted to see young people also realize the value and power of learning. Thus, the established the Allen Foundation, which for years has contributed to many educational causes, including Milton High School's longest running scholarship. Over the course of the last 40 plus years, the Allen Foundation has contributed over \$1 million to Milton graduates who plan to attend college after high school. Their legacy of selflessness, generosity, and commitment continues to shine, and serve as an example, to all in Milton.

American Association of University Women Scholarship

The American University of Women scholarship is awarded to deserving seniors who are planning on continuing their education at a college, or technical school as a full time student.

The American University of Women promotes education and equality for all women and girls, lifelong education and positive societal change. We congratulate all students on their accomplishments and their commitment to education and are proud to encourage students in their pursuit of a degree.

American Legion – Post # 367 Scholarship

The American Legion – Post #367 scholarship is awarded to deserving seniors who have a mother, father, grandparent, aunt or uncle that has served in the armed forces. Students receiving this scholarship must have maintained at least a 3.0 GPA throughout High School.

Badger State Ethanol Scholarship

The Badger State Ethanol scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior going into any agricultural area. This scholarship may be used for any post-secondary school in the state of Wisconsin. The scholarship will be paid upon successful completion of first semester and proof of enrollment for second semester.

Dave Czerwinski Memorial Scholarship



Dave Czerwinski fought a 13-month battle with stage 4 pancreatic and liver cancer. Dave's fight was fierce and recognized as an inspiration to the friends and family who shared in his fight. In a present tense post, Dave wrote, "If I'm going to go out....I'm going out with my head held high knowing I did the best I could as a person and as a father to the most wonderful kids in the world."

Dave passed away on January 16, 2018 at the age of 39. During his battle, friends and family wore bracelets that read: "have courage...just breathe...live in the present tense."

Dave lived his life--before and during cancer. Playing darts and bags, bowling, camping, Pearl Jam concerts, vacations, Packer, Badger and Brewer games, UFC fights, and being a foodie are just a few of his favorite things---all would include laughter and a group of friends.

Dave worked as a graphic designer and salesman for Kollege Town Sports, which lead to many of his Milton connections. His greatest love was of his two daughters: Trinity and Camryn Czerwinski. One of Trinity's final messages to Dave was that he was the "greatest man every day of [her] life" and one of Camryn's final messages was that she was so proud of him being a fighter.

Many lives have been forever changed by knowing Dave.

David Clark Scholarship

The \$500 scholarship is award to two (2) high school seniors. The scholarship is open to all senior students who plan to obtain a higher education that will use it to one day make an impact on people's lives.

Discovering Democracy Scholarship Sponsored by the Spaulding Family and Don Vruwink

The Discovering Democracy scholarship is awarded to a deserving student who has shown an excellence in AP Government. Students receiving this scholarship must have maintained a grade of C or better while taking the AP Government Class at Milton High School.

Don Kildow Memorial Scholarship

Don Kildow was a 1948 graduate of Milton High School, as was his wife, Shirley. Don grew up in adversity having lost his father at a young age. He never had the opportunity for formal education, but was truly a self-made man. He learned the carpentry trade, including masonry, plumbing, concrete, and was an excellent finish carpenter. He later went on to create his own originally designed fleet of snow plows, which were featured on Channel 3 TV. He finished his career in excavating.

Don was a respected business man in the town of Milton his entire life, not retiring until the age of 75. He valued a strong work ethic, and prided himself in delivering the highest quality work possible. Don passed away in 2017 at the age of 88. He would be proud today to be contributing to the education of a student planning a career in the trades.

Edgerton Hospital Auxiliary Scholarship

The Edgerton Hospital Auxiliary scholarship is awarded to deserving students each year that are planning on enrolling in a program leading to a degree or certification in nursing, medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, therapy or any other health care related field. Selection is based on need, community and church activities and a student's GPA.

Edwin A. Kapek Scholarship

The Edwin A. Kapek scholarship is awarded to deserving seniors each year that are planning on continuing their education at a two or four year college as a full time student. Students receiving this scholarship must have completed six seasons of sports and held a GPA of 2.75 or higher. Students must also maintain a C average their first semester of college.

Friends of the Milton Public Library Scholarship



For the Friends of the Milton Public Library scholarship, the committee looked for students who have made the Milton Public Library a part of their educational and personal journey. The library offers several opportunities for students to volunteer, be a spokesperson for their peers, and make a difference at the library and in turn, for the community. The committee looked at a student's commitment to the library through these opportunities, how he or she represented the library, and the connections made with staff and community members through their work. Beyond that, the committee looked for a genuine appreciation of the library and what it represents. They sought out students who utilize the library for personal growth in the areas of reading, life-long learning, and skill development through the library's programs. This was the first year the Friends created and offered a scholarship, and they look forward to supporting graduating seniors in the years to come.

Hal and Martha Deal Memorial Scholarship

The Hal and Martha Deal Memorial Scholarship is offered in memory of our parents.

Martha Jane Bowen Deal was born in Martins Ferry, Ohio in 1921. Hal R. Deal was born in 1924 on a dairy farm in Chandlersville, Ohio. Mom and Dad met at Ohio State University where he graduated as a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine and she received her Bachelor and Master's degrees in Latin. They both served in the Navy in WWII. They were married on September 27, 1949 and then moved to Milton. Dad opened the Rock Veterinary Clinic. His passion was large animal practice, where he served farmers and farming families for many years. He took great pride in treating every animal as though it was his own.

Mom and Dad always stressed the importance of getting an education, and often helped and encouraged area students in pursing their education. Dad served on the school board and Mom volunteered in the classroom, as Girl Scout leader and tutor. Each year, they supported the FFA by giving them access to several acres of land at our home to raise experimental crops.

They were humble and grateful people. They loved living in Milton and getting to know all the good people! They encouraged us and many in our community to follow our dreams, that everything is possible, and to be sure to help others along the way in life.

Mom had cancer for many years and died October 23, 1975. Dad had several heart surgeries, always jumping right back in to serve our area farmers. He died in April 17, 1984. They always appreciated the wonderful caring and support that our family received from many in our community.

This scholarship was created in their memory to continue their encouragement of students today. We know they would be honored to play a small role in helping local Milton area students fulfill their education, along with their hopes and dreams in their lives.

Hammer Chiropractic Scholarship



Since 1996, Hammer Chiropractic and Rehab has been pleased to support a scholarship to a graduating Milton student entering the Healthcare field. Previous recipients have spanned all areas of healthcare, including nursing, dental, veterinary, mental health, physical therapy and chiropractic. Dr. Hammer and staff extend a heartfelt congratulations to all the Milton graduates.

Janesville Area Crime Stoppers Scholarship

Crime Stoppers is a non-profit organization operated by a volunteer community board of directors. Crime Stoppers encourages the reporting of information or leads which can assist law enforcement with solving crimes. Our goal is to help in the fight against crime but it is not part of the local police or sheriff's department. Generally a law enforcement coordinator participates as an advisor to the board but is a non-voting member. The citizen's board is responsible for operations of the program, fund raising, public relations, and approval of rewards. All funds used by local Crime Stoppers organizations to pay rewards or to cover operating expenses are raised in the local community. Most of the funds raised come through donations from citizens and businesses in the community. Crime Stoppers also uses a variety of fund raising events (golf outings, ad sales, etc.) to help raise funds. Volunteers run the program and there are no wage related expenses. When they are available, law enforcement grants are also utilized to assist each program for such needs as a computer purchase or to pay rewards. Janesville Area Crime Stoppers has been very effective. Since 1985 Janesville Area Crime Stoppers have accounted for over 1300 arrests, recovered \$ 1,000,000 in stolen property, money and illegal narcotics. \$57,000 in rewards was paid to individuals providing information anonymously to solve those cases.

Janesville Morning Rotary "Service above Self" Scholarship

The Janesville Morning Rotary Club was chartered June 30, 1983, and is one of Janesville's most popular and prestigious service clubs. We are recognized as a progressive club that completes two major fund raisers each year. We host the Pie Ride in June, which is a bicycle event with multiple courses to appeal to both families or avid cyclists. We also have a fruit basket sale in December. These fundraisers allow us to award more than \$25,000 in grants to local organizations, as well as provide scholarships like this to students furthering their education. "Having fun and making a difference!" is our club's motto, and exemplifies what our members stand for.

Janesville Area Education Association (JAREA) Scholarship

The JAREA scholarship is awarded to deserving senior's each year that are planning on furthering their education at a college or university with the plans to graduate with a degree in the field of education. Students receiving this scholarship must attend college on a full-time basis while maintaining at least a 2.0 GPA. This scholarship is given in honor of someone who dedicated their life to the field of education.

Josh Pelton Memorial Scholarship

The Josh Pelton Memorial scholarship is awarded to four deserving seniors each year that are planning on continuing their education at a college, technical or trade school as a full time student. Students receiving this scholarship must have been active in multiple extra-curricular school activities and has held at least a part time job.

Jessica Szerlong Bright Future Memorial Scholarship

Jessica Szerlong was the most spirited Redhawk I have ever known. At 4 years old, she was asked what she would like to be when she grew up. Without hesitation she chimed, "A teenager!" As her mom, I did a bit of an eye roll. However, when Jessica arrived at her teen years and her beloved MHS, I realized that she truly epitomized that role. Jessica was a teenager through and through. She was full of life, full of love for her school, and eager to participate in all she could. And she did just that. Jessica was a goalie for the soccer team, an enthusiastic member of our then Treble Clef choir, and a football and basketball cheerleader. Of those her dearest love was her cheerleading. As I said, she had more spirit than anyone I've ever known and with cheering she put that spirit to good use.

When Jessica died on October 4, 2015, at age 30, we were all stunned. It was unexpected at best. Our Jessie, no more? It couldn't be. Her spirit, her love of life, her need and want to help others. Gone? She hasn't achieved all her dreams!! Over the next few months, we all thought of ways to best remember her and help others to keep her memory alive as well. Many ideas came forth. This scholarship is just one. It is though, one dear to our hearts simply because Jessica so thoroughly loved her years as a Milton Redhawk. Nothing brings back memories of her more than her time here.

And so each year, the Szerlong Family, to honor and remember Jessica Lynn and her years here at MHS, will award this scholarship in her name. To honor Jessica's memory, those who apply must have been involved in Women's Choir (Octave Above), girls soccer, or cheerleading for at least 3 of 4 years at MHS. They should have a strong inner need to serve others and have done so through their community or church. Those applying should be enthusiastic about all they do. When looking over applications, we look for those qualities and for those who have Jessica's same love of life and others. While we miss our Jessica Lynn desperately, and always will, we are thrilled to award a scholarship in her name each year to a young lady who lives as she lived.

JP Cullen Foundation Scholarship

The JP Cullen Foundation scholarship was established to support students seeking careers in the construction and engineering professions. The recipient must demonstrate core fundamental values towards becoming a future leader not only in their community, but career. Being the best in your career provides the resources necessary to support your community.

Kevin Ekedahl Cancer Survivor/Caregiver Scholarship

Our family's tradition of providing scholarships to students whose lives have been impacted by cancer is a tribute to Kevin Ekedahl, a husband and father who inspired us and loved us. His long and complicated cancer journey, which ended in 2008, helped us to understand that cancer is not a solitary experience. We recognize that cancer diagnoses and treatments impact the patient and all who provide care.

Kevin loved the idea of using funeral memorials to establish this particular scholarship. It is an honor for our growing family to continue to supplement, in some small way, expenses for students wishing to pursue additional education.

This scholarship is not based on school performance or some measure of excellence. It is offered simply in memory of a man who remained steady and hopeful amidst a "roller coaster" of challenges, celebrations, and normal daily life. Kevin loved kids and valued education, so this memorial holds a piece of him each time a scholarship is awarded.

Matt Schimmel Fielder's Choice Scholarship

The Matt Schimmel Fielder's Choice Scholarship commemorates the leadership and dedication of 2018 Milton High School graduate Matt Schimmel. Matt's immense knowledge of the game, combined with his drive to be successful, effectively illustrated positive leadership and good sportsmanship. Matt continually sought to enhance the program and worked diligently to fulfill his role on the team. This scholarship seeks to honor his commitment and contribution to Milton's baseball program by carrying his legacy forward to future generations.

MHS Drama Scholarship

The MHS Drama Scholarship is intended to recognize a student who has been involved in the Drama programs, plays, either on stage or back stage, during their high school years. The scholarship is awarded after successful (2.0 or better GPA) completion of one semester of full-time post-secondary education and subsequent enrollment in the second semester.

MHS Forensics Scholarship

Each year the MHS Forensics Team raises money to provide at least one deserving graduating Senior a \$100 college scholarship. These students have demonstrated a commitment to our team via competition and leadership while maintaining a tradition of academic excellence.

MHS French Scholarship

The MHS French scholarship is awarded to two deserving students each year who are planning on continuing their French education. Students receiving this scholarship must be graduating seniors who are currently MHS French students and have been active members of either Milton French Clubs or the French Honor Society. Half of the award will be presented after successful completion of the first college level French course. The other half will be presented after the completion of the second college level French course. The courses do not need to be taken consecutively and could be taken at different academic institutions.

MHS Student Council Leadership Scholarship

The MHS Student Council Leadership scholarship is awarded to deserving seniors each year that are planning on continuing their education at a college, technical or trade school as a full time student. Selection for this scholarship is based on leadership and active participation in student body functions. Student council membership is not mandatory to receive this scholarship.

Milton Band Parents Association Scholarship



The Milton Band Parents are proud to carry on their decades-long tradition of awarding scholarships to Milton High School band members, recognizing those students who best exemplify the commitment, self-confidence, responsibility, appreciation for hard-work, and belonging that the music program hopes to impart on them.

Rehearsals, band camps, show run-throughs, performances. Day after day, week after week. They did it because they had to, but also because they wanted to. They made a commitment, and others counted on them to be there. They showed that pride is a good thing. They carried themselves onto the field like winners, and they were. They were responsible for themselves. "Early is on time, and on time is late." They took ownership for their performance. They were responsible for their instrument(s), their uniform, and every detail down to the plume in their hat. Putting on a performance, a concert, a parade routine, or any other band show took months of practice. It was a labor of love, and it was intense. Physical work, but it felt good. There were no benchwarmers in marching band. For many, marching band was their first "belonging" experience. Their common experiences, like the overnight bus trips and long parade routes, created a bond between them and their bandmates. They had extra gloves when someone forgot theirs, and they had an extra bag of chips at midnight on the bus when someone was starving. It was one big family. They took care of one another.

This "belonging" is probably the most powerful life lesson they took away from marching band. In band, they belonged to a group of over one hundred very different individuals who, after long hours of commitment and hard work, came together in a band that created a beautiful blend of sound and visuals. It all worked, thanks to the different talents that each person brought.

Milton Basketball Boosters Scholarship

The Milton Basketball Boosters scholarship is awarded to deserving seniors each year who are planning on continuing their education at a college, technical or trade school as a full time student. Students receiving this scholarship must have been a part of the MHS Basketball team for all four years of their high school career.

Milton Education Association (MEA) Scholarship

The Milton Education Association (MEA) scholarship is awarded to one deserving student each year that is planning on furthering their education at a university, technical or community college with the plans to graduate with a degree in the field of education. Students receiving this scholarship must maintain 12 credits with a 2.0 GPA their first semester. Preference for this scholarship is given to a child of an MEA member.

Milton Garden Guild Scholarship

The Milton Garden Guild scholarship is awarded to one deserving senior each year that is planning on continuing their education at a college, technical or trade school as a full time student. Students receiving this scholarship must have a passion for the plant sciences and be pursuing a career in botany, horticulture or other garden related field.

Milton Marlin Swim Club Scholarship



The Milton Marlin Scholarship program began in 1993 to honor graduating Seniors who participated on the Milton Marlins Swim Club and the Milton High School Swim Team. Criteria for the award includes team dedication, determination, sportsmanship and scholarship.

The annual 4th of July Milton Mile Swim event is the primary fundraiser supporting this scholarship. Through the funds raised, the club has been able to award scholarships to several graduating Seniors each school year. To date, it is estimated that over nineteen thousand dollars have been awarded to over eighty participants.

Milton Masonic Lodge Scholarship

The Milton Masonic Lodge scholarship is awarded to two deserving seniors each year who are planning on continuing their education at a college as a full time student. Selection is based on commendable academic record; leadership ability; and service to school, church and community.

Milton Masonic Lodge Technical School Scholarship

The Milton Masonic Lodge Technical School Scholarship is awarded to one deserving senior each year who is planning on continuing their education at a technical/trade school as a full-time or part time and employed student. Selection is based on commendable academic record; leadership ability; and service to school, church, and community

Milton Optimist Club Scholarship

The Milton Optimist Club scholarship is awarded to deserving seniors each year who are planning on continuing their education at a college, or technical school as a full time student. Selection is based on extracurricular involvement, including community service, school activities and goals and purposes. All students who are chosen for this award have a GPA of 3.0 or better.

Milton Show Choir Scholarship

The Milton Show Choir scholarship is awarded to deserving seniors each year that are planning on continuing their education at a college, or vocational school as a full time student. Students receiving this scholarship must be current members of show choir.

Peggie passed away unexpectedly of a very sudden illness just before Thanksgiving in 2015. She had a generous spirit, a warm smile, and always put others first. Peggie's husband and children decided to put all of the generous donations they received from family members, friends, and the community toward the establishment of a scholarship in Peggie's name. Peggie was a big believer in education. She was her children's first teacher, and growing up, she always talked about when (not if) they would go to college. It is in large part due to her influence that both of her children are proud public educators today.

Penni Selck's spirit and enthusiasm for her students will continue on for generations to come.
